Urgent This Week:

- Remind yourself and your family to be vigilant about not responding to spam. A thousand people gave away their bank account numbers and passwords because they responded to an email hoax claiming that their bank was on the verge of collapse. The e-mail had a keystroke logger attached, so when they went to the bank's website to check on their accounts, the crooks got their account numbers and passwords. Don't respond to spam and make sure your friends and family know not to respond, either.
- Get the Microsoft Update from this past week if you haven't already. It included about a dozen updates, including several that were labeled "critical." Go to http://www.microsoft.com to get the update.
- Firefox users who haven't upgraded yet to the latest release (version 1.5.0.4) should go to http://www.mozilla.com and get the update.

Important to Do Every Week:

- Run a backup of your important computer files and store it in a safe location.
- Update your anti-spyware software and run it. If you need free anti-spyware software, visit http://www.safer-networking.org/en/spybotsd/ and download Spybot Search and Destroy.
- Update your anti-virus software and run it. If you need free anti-virus software, visit http://free.grisoft.com and download AVG Anti-Virus.
